Mr. Boyd is the Chief of the C-130 Hercules Division, Mobility Directorate, Air Force Life Cycle Management Center, Robins Air Force Base, Georgia, effective 30 July 2017. He is responsible for acquisition, modernization and sustainment of the more than 900 Air Force and foreign C-130s around the world. He leads an integrated program team of over 500 personnel executing over \$4B from two locations within the Air Force Materiel Command. The C-130 Hercules Division ensures operational safety, suitability and effectiveness of the Hercules fleet worldwide.

Mr. Boyd's career has included dynamic broadening experiences as an aircraft and munitions maintenance officer at one of the most active flying units in the Air Force, as well as time instructing the next generation of Air Force leaders in the Reserve Officer Training Corps program. He is certified as a Level III Program Manager in the Acquisition Professional Development Program, and has managed an ACAT IAC program into sustainment. He was hand-selected as the executive officer for the 3-star Electronic Systems Center Commander and Program Executive Officer for Command and Control and Combat Support systems. In his last assignment on active duty, he served as the deputy chief of the Special Operations Force and Personnel Recovery Division. Mr. Boyd was deployed in 2010 as the Deputy J7 on the US Forces – Afghanistan staff in Kabul, Afghanistan. Mr. Boyd retired as a Lieutenant Colonel effective 31 January 2012 after almost 22 years of active commissioned service in the United States Air Force. His first assignment as a civil servant was the C-130 Foreign Military Sales Branch Chief. Mr. Boyd is married to Roxanne Boyd, and they have five children, Luke, Rebekah, Rachel, Hannah, and Nathan.
